City of Jackson Citizens:

When I became Mayor of the City of Jackson, I made a pledge to improve our city's 54 parks and recreational facilities, as well as their programming opportunities. Under the Department of Parks and Recreation Director Ramie Ford, we have been able to create an impressive report card – one that shows marks of major improvements. The following examples are specific goals that were accomplished during the past year:

- Completed \$1 million in improvements to parks and recreational facilities, including Smith Wills Stadium, Tennis Center South, Grove Park, Forest Hill Park and the Westbrook House, a new cricket field and BMX bike trail at Buddy Butts Park and new playground equipment at various city parks.
- The City of Jackson partnered with Entergy Mississippi and the Jackson Senators to purchase playground equipment for Poindexter Park. The playground equipment was dedicated to the Police and Firemen who died September 11th, 2001.
- Development of a new tennis clinic which yielded 200 participants its first year, as well as 125 more sports teams than last year. Nearly 8,000 patrons visited our city pools this summer.
- We have also secured several national tournaments for 2005 and 2006. In 2005, Jackson will host the "Men's National Church Softball Tournament". In 2006, Jackson will host the "Men's Class 'A' Slow-Pitch Softball Tournament" and the "Ladies 35 and Older Masters Tournament".

These are just a few of the highlights, and I encourage each of you to use this publication to take advantage of these and many other improvements. You have my commitment that we will continue to improve and upgrade our parks and recreational facilities, adding to Jackson's appeal not only as a capital city, but also as a destination location with outstanding credentials as a convention city. We want the world to know that Jackson is the "Best of the New South" in every way.

The tennis division is the newest division offering services to the citizens of the Capital City. The division began offering tennis services in March of 1999. Since it's inception, the City has developed new and innovative programs designed to build interest in the sport of tennis. The most recent venture for the tennis division was the addition of a school based program in conjunction with Jackson Public Schools, which allows tennis instruction for students during physical education periods. The division also operates twelve tennis courts at Battlefield Park. These courts are open to the public except during tournaments or special play.

The tennis division provides special services

USA Tennis 1-2-3 (Level 1: Basic Instruction)

Six-sesson group instructional program designed for beginners to learn the basic skills needed to play tennis using drills and special activities. Skill development will be action-oriented providing an opportunity for fun and fitness.

USA Tennis 1-2-3 (Level 2: Supervised Play)

Six-sesson group instructional and supervised play program designed for beyond beginners to continue skill development. Participants will learn new shots in match situations not included in previous lessons.

USA Team Tennis

Six-sesson group of organized play for those progressing past USA Tennis 1-2-3 Levels 1 & 2. Friendly doubles competition will give developing players of similar abilities an experience emphasizing the fun, fitness and social benefits of tennis.

USA Junior Team Tennis

Six-sessons of ongoing development for advanced and aspiring tournament players. Conditioning, shot selection and strategy will be emphasized with drills and match play.

Individual Lessons

Individual lessons are available upon request Monday - Saturday. Individual instruction is available for adult men and women, individuals with special needs, as well as instruction for senior citizen players. Special instruction for children from inner-city are also available. All instructional tennis programs offered are designed to allow each individual to progress at their own pace to the extent of their ability.

Pool Rental Rules & Fees

All pool reservations are \$40 per hour with a \$20 non-refundable deposit due the next business day after making the reservation. All swimming pool reservations must be paid in full by cashiers check or money order within three business days of the reservation. All reservations are handled at the administrative office only. Reservations are determined by the availability of staff.

- 2. Must be twenty-one years of age or older to rent a pool.
- 3. Park Rangers will patrol all park facilities, however, security for events will be the responsibility of the reserving party.
- 4. Each person MUST shower before entering the pool.
- 5. No smoking, horse-playing, gymnastic activity, alcoholic beverages, food, drink, glass containers, weapons, profanity, improper behavior or vulgar language allowed in or outside the pool area.
- 6. No diving in shallow or crowded areas.
- 7. Patrons with open sores or infectious diseases are not permitted in the pool area.

Mynelle Gardens began as a private garden created by Mynelle Westbrook Haywood, a Jackson native of national reputation in flower arranging and gardening. Mrs. Hayward traveled widely, gathering rare flowers and gaining inspiration for the gardens she maintained around her home on Clinton Boulevard. A seven-acre collage of several distinct gardens, they are further accented with winding pathways, cascading pools and distinctive bridges which lead you across the pond to an island oasis. It typifies the southern garden with features worth emulating in our own backyards. In years past it was the scene of garden parties, civic fund raisers, therapy for World War II recovering soldiers and has been visited by garden enthusiasts from throughout the world.

Mynelle Gardens displays azaleas, daylilies, and camellias, as well as hundreds of perennnials, annuals and naturalized bulbs in carefully landscaped settings. The gardens change with the seasons, even with the time of day, but the mood is always tranquil despite the gardens' close location to downtown Jackson.

The gardens are open for spring reservations for weddings and wedding receptions, as well as for a variety of meetings. Visitors are welcome to picnic on the grounds, and photographers and artists are encouraged to visit.

Mynelle Gardens is a wildlife sanctuary and a haven for songbirds. Mynelle Gardens' Gift Shop offers Mississippi crafts, gifts and items related to gardening.

Purchased by the City of Jackson in 1973, the gardens are now maintained by the City with the help of many devoted community volunteers who constantly seek to add to the beauty of the spaces and to make Mynelle Gardens an integral part of the life of the community.
